

BRISBANE AT A GLANCE



Perhaps due to friendly interstate rivalry, Brisbane has often been seen as the much smaller sibling of Sydney and Melbourne. In reality, Brisbane is a seriously big place compared to any other town in Queensland. With over 2.5 million people, Brisbane can offer students absolutely everything they could ever need. With beautiful weather and a relaxed vibe on offer all-year round, it's little surprise that Brisbane is often regarded as the friendliest city in Australia.

Brisbane's city centre combines modern high-rise buildings with 19th century historic architecture. It's a lively hub of businesses, shops, restaurants, bars and non-stop action.

Queen Street Mall lies at the heart of Brisbane's city centre and is one of Australia's most popular pedestrian shopping strips. Packed with locals and visitors every day of the week, it's lined with restaurants, cafes, retail boutiques, food courts and multi-level department stores for everything you need. Nearby, Elizabeth Street, Edward Street, Albert Street and Adelaide Street offer more opportunities for some serious retail therapy.

Breathe in the fresh air at the lush City Botanic Gardens on Alice Street. As the oldest city park in Brisbane, it blooms with tropical flora and fauna with plenty of picnic tables and shady spots to sit and watch the Brisbane River.

The Riverstage is also located within the City Botanic Gardens and is the venue for many major concerts, festivals and entertainment events.

Shop for local produce, fashion and accessories at the Brisbane City Markets every Wednesday and Thursday. You can also catch the BrisStyle Markets on select days throughout the year for locally made arts and crafts. The popular Twilight Markets are located in King George Square and see designers and makers selling their handmade jewellery, art, unique gifts and gourmet food.

Central Brisbane is a foodie's dream, and you'll find all kinds of cuisines in the many restaurants, cafes, bars and taverns located across the area.

BRISBANE CITY



WEST END & SOUTH BANK



West End and South Bank make up the heart of Brisbane's arts and culture scene. Trendy, modern and a little quirky, they overflow with museums, theatres, cafes, bars and stylish boutiques.

South Bank is Brisbane's main cultural precinct. The Queensland Art Gallery and Gallery of Modern Art (QAGOMA) offers spectacular exhibitions showcasing local and international art year-round. Take in some history at the Queensland Museum and Sciencentre next door, or cross the road and catch a live show at the Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC).

The South Bank Parklands are the go-to destination for picnics in the sun, strolls, award-winning eateries and major festivals and entertainment events. Take a ride on the iconic Wheel of Brisbane for breathtaking city views or swim at Streets Beach – Australia's only inner-city man-made beach right in the heart of the Parklands.

Little Stanley Street and Grey Street are lined with diverse restaurants, cafes and bars.

West End embraces individuality, and its eccentric boutiques offer something for everyone. Stop in at SWOP Clothing Exchange on Boundary Street, a haven for second-hand clothes and accessories. St Veronica's Thrift Shop also sells unique second-hand clothes and preloved treasures at bargain prices. The Happy Cabin on Vulture Street has a colourful selection of clothes and quirky gifts, while Bent Books is a brightly painted bookstore selling second-hand books.

Fortitude Valley, New Farm and Newstead are great for nightlife and entertainment, with countless bars, restaurants, live music venues and a buzzing laneway scene.


Fortitude Valley, or "The Valley" as the locals call it, is the place to go for a night out. Check out local and international DJs at the trendy bars and clubs lining Brunswick Street, Wickham Street and the laneways. The Press Club, Family, Laruche and The Met are some of the best.

Chinatown Mall in Fortitude Valley bursts with colour and culture. Snap a selfie at the traditional Chinese gates before exploring Chinese supermarkets, yum cha restaurants, takeaway eateries and more.

New Farm Park is the place to go for picnics and lengthy strolls. Right next door is the Brisbane Powerhouse. Built in the 1920s as a power station to supply electricity to Brisbane's old trams, the building is now an iconic arts and entertainment centre. Catch comedy shows, cabaret, theatre, live music, art exhibitions, free events, festivals and more.

Not to be outdone, The Triffid in Newstead is one of Brisbane's most famous music venues. Once an aircraft hangar during World War II, it now hosts some of the most exciting local and international performers. There's also a beer garden that serves pub food and drinks so you can relax and get to know the locals while soaking up Brisbane's music scene.







Student Accommodation

Price range: AUD\$250-\$650 per week

Pros:

Transportation



Brisbane's public transport network is operated by Translink. In Brisbane specifically, it includes a large network of buses, trains, and ferries which help connect Brisbane residents from **A**scot **to Z**illmere, and everywhere in between Students can pick up a Go Card from selected retailers and train stations, and eligible full-time students can register for discounted concession fares. Once you've got your Go Card, topping up your balance and managing your card is easily done online. You can buy a go card onlone or at over 680 locations across South East Queensland. When you purchase your go card you'll pay a refundable deposit of \$10 (adult) or \$5 (concession).

The Translink App is a must-download for any resident in Brisbane. It provides real-time updates on all services, and allows you to plan out any journey. Enable location services and the Translink app will show you all current public transport services in your immediate area, allowing you to get to where you're going with little stress.

While you may not be a master of Brisbane's public transport network after one day, it won't take long before it becomes second nature. Just don't forget to tap on and tap off with your Go Card!

Brisbane is also a very walkable and rideable city. Many students find it more convenient to walk or ride to their destination, and this can be done very easily in inner-Brisbane's flat terrain. It's good for the environment, good for your health, and good for your wallet.

Buses

Brisbane has a comprehensive bus service that runs throughout the city, connecting the outer and inner suburbs to the CBD, major shopping centres, entertainment and dining precincts, railway stations and ferry terminals.




Trains

Queensland's speedy network of electric trains has the Greater Brisbane region covered and provides direct access to the city, neighbourhood precincts and outer suburbs.



Ferries

Let the river be your guide. Affectionately known as CityCats, ferries are an enjoyable way to explore Brisbane. Glide along the river with CityCat and CityFerry services. It's perfect for sightseeing and accessing key spots.



TO CAR OR NOT TO CAR

Moving to Brisbane with a car is a complicated situation. While there's plenty of free parking in the streets of Brisbane's suburbs, you'd likely be far away from the universities and attractions of the inner city. And even when it comes time to drive into the inner city, expect to pay a steep price for short-term parking.

For students that can afford it, long-term car parks in inner-Brisbane can cost anywhere between \$50-200 per week depending on their location. With excellent public transport options throughout the city, most students

chose to forego their car in order to save money. Students who live at Student One and studying at QUT or UQ, for example, will almost never need to use a car in their day-to-day life. Especially as we have a free daily shuttle to/from UQ.

Employment

Brisbane's job market is full of opportunities for students, though it pays to apply for jobs in the right way. Make sure your resume is up-todate and that your references are in order before applying for any job. More people and more jobs also means more competition, so it's important to ensure that your applications are of a high quality. Have your friends and family look over your resume, or consider paying for a professional to edit your resume to a professional level.

Retail and hospitality are two key industries that employ students on a parttime or casual basis. The size of the business will often influence how you apply for the role. While you might have success with small businesses by submitting your resume in-person, larger businesses will almost always manage their recruitment through online avenues like Seek, Indeed, or their own company websites.

For regional or interstate students moving to Brisbane, there is no greater boost to your job security than to transfer within your current company. With most larger companies having locations nationwide. relocating students often successfully request to transfer their job to a Brisbane-based location. This can provide muchneeded income and certainty during the big move to Brisbane.



Financial Support



While Student One regularly offers a range of accommodation scholarships, financial support is also available for eligible students through other avenues. Students moving to Brisbane are often eligible for Centrelink payments such as Youth Allowance, Austudy, and Relocation Scholarships. Eligiblity and waiting times for Centrelink varies wildly, so it's important to be proactive, persistent, and organised when applying for Centrelink support.

Brisbane universities also offer a wide range of financial support, usually in the form of scholarships or bursaries. Again, eligibility varies wildly and there is usually plenty of competition from other students. Apply early and often, and seek as much information as you can from the relevant scholarship departments of each university.
